A. Command and Control/Governance	B. Plan Guidance, Organization & Procedures	<p>• Have capabilities given our government institutions need for getting us through crisis? Is the network strong to carry out the rules/government's mission and its objectives?</p> <p>• Are we able to coordinate and direct the control system and organizational conduct for the command and control coordination? What are the best practices? How do we get it done? Can we afford to have a viable COOP capability now?</p> <p>• Provide clear documentation of all critical handling functions such as creation, modification, approval, issuance and execution of plans.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop inter-relationships of COOP related terms (EMVAP, FEMA, etc.) • Government emergency planning and legislative model • Emergency plan change/investigation process • Planes ready for implementation both with and without warlike • Interplay with other agency plans and the overall Emergency Management System elements (EOP or identification of same) • Check for common advantages of external agency (old time partners) • Promote COOP capability using a multi-year strategy and program management plan. • Outline the policy so the agency will follow to designate essential functions and resources • Define short and long-term COOP goals and objectives • Define centralized financial management roles and financial management processes • Anticipate and address issues and potential obstacles, and establish planning milestones • Develop and document an executive decision process that would allow for a review of the emergency and determination of the best course of action for response and recovery • Ensure plans are based on an all hazards approach • Document process to manage outreach to public sector for business continuity planning and public communications
